“INTERNATIONAL COUNTER-NARCOTICS SPECIALIZATION COURSE”

GENERAL RECOMMENDATIONS FOR PARTICIPANTS:

1. Weather in Córdoba, Argentina (September)

- **Average temperatures:** 8°C to 12°C during the night and early morning, and 22°C to 28°C during the day.
- **Conditions:** Mild and sunny days generally prevail, with cool mornings and a low probability of rainfall. Sudden temperature changes and occasional winds may occur.
- **Recommendation:** Participants should bring comfortable mid-season clothing, a light layer for the early morning and evening, and a lightweight jacket in case of a drop in temperature.

2. Currency and Exchange Rates (Euro/US Dollar to Argentine Peso) – Information as of 17 June 2026

- **Official exchange market::**
 - **USD 1 ≈ ARS 1.440**
 - **EUR 1 ≈ ARS 1,660, with an approximate average of ARS 1,665**

Please note: Exchange rates may vary depending on the service used, including exchange offices, banks and digital platforms, as well as the time of the transaction. For large or important transactions, participants are advised to verify the applicable real-time exchange rate..

3. Electricity and Connectivity

- **Voltage:** 220 V, Frequency 50 Hz.
- **Plug types:** Type C, with two round pins, and Type I, with three angled flat pins.
- **Recommendation:** participants should bring a universal travel adapter.
- **Connectivity:** Córdoba has good mobile telephone coverage through providers such as Claro, Personal and Movistar. SIM cards may be purchased at the airport or from authorised retail outlets.

4. Health and Medical Insurance

- The following documents are mandatory:
 - A medical fitness certificate stating that the participant is “FIT FOR DUTY”, issued in the participant’s country of origin..



- International medical insurance providing coverage in the Argentine Republic.
 - Participants are also advised to bring a small personal first-aid kit containing any regularly used medication, insect repellent, sunscreen and adhesive dressings.
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5. Transportation and Logistics

- **Airport of arrival:** Ingeniero Aeronáutico Ambrosio Taravella International Airport, Province of Córdoba, Argentine Republic.
- **Arrival date:** 6 September 2026. This is the final scheduled date for the reception and registration of participants.
- **Departure date:** 15 September 2026, the day following the conclusion of the course, scheduled for 14 September 2026..
- **Transportation provided:** Round-trip transportation from the airport to Mobile Detachment No. 3 in Colonia Caroya.
- **International airfare:** To be covered by the invited country.
- **Flight arrangements:**

Participants shall identify and arrange flights and connections that will allow them to:

- Arrive in Córdoba on 6 September 2026.
- Return to their respective countries on 15 September 2026.
- Take into account that many itineraries may involve connections through Buenos Aires, either Aeroparque Jorge Newbery or Ezeiza International Airport, or through other international cities before continuing to Córdoba.
- Book sufficiently in advance and allow adequate connection times between international and domestic flights within Argentina.

Domestic transportation will only be provided following arrival in Córdoba.

6. Accommodation and Meals

- The host country will provide: **Accommodation, Meals, Training materials, Local transportation.**
 - Participants are requested to report in advance any dietary restrictions or relevant medical conditions.
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7. Physical Activity and Training

- The course includes intensive activities, consisting of: Extended training days from 06:00 to 20:00. Night training activities from 22:00 to 02:00.
 - Participants should bring sportswear, comfortable and durable footwear, a cap or hat, a water bottle or canteen, and sunscreen.
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8. Additional Useful Information

- **Language:** The course will be conducted in Spanish. A dictionary or translation application may therefore be useful.
 - **Personal security:** Participants should keep their identification documents and valuables in a safe place.
 - **Local culture:** Córdoba is widely recognised for its hospitality. Participants are encouraged to engage openly in cultural interaction with instructors and fellow students.

INTERNATIONAL COUNTER-NARCOTICS SPECIALIZATION COURSE

1. COURSE OBJECTIVES

GENERAL OBJECTIVE:

To strengthen and develop specialised technical, operational and analytical competencies for the planning, direction and execution of judicial investigations and law-enforcement operations aimed at preventing, detecting and combating illicit drug trafficking and organised drug-related crime.

The course also seeks to promote knowledge and application of international cooperation mechanisms, criminal intelligence sharing and operational assistance among security forces, judicial authorities and other competent entities, in accordance with applicable standards, good practices and existing inter-agency and transnational coordination frameworks.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES:

1. To acquire a comprehensive geopolitical perspective on the current situation and evolution of organised crime.
2. To identify the legal and procedural mechanisms, as well as the agencies and institutions involved in information exchange and international cooperation for the investigation, prevention and prosecution of organised crime.
3. To recognise and apply the analytical and investigative tools, techniques and methodologies required for the effective performance of specialised law-enforcement duties.
4. To acquire fundamental knowledge and skills related to the tactical intervention techniques required to operate in hostile and high-risk environments.
5. To understand the different stages of the illicit drug-trafficking chain, from cultivation and production to the transportation, distribution and sale of illicit substances at both the national and international levels.
6. To apply operational procedures related to the restraint, custody and transportation of detained persons, in strict compliance with applicable regulations and international standards.

2. PERSONNEL TO BE TRAINED:

The course is intended for foreign participants, including male and female junior commissioned officers and junior non-commissioned officers, or personnel holding equivalent ranks within the participating foreign force, between 20 and 30 years of age.

- THREE (3): Personnel of the Argentine National Gendarmerie.
- TWELVE (12): Personnel from foreign police forces.

Total number of participants: FIFTEEN (15).

Upon reporting to the facilities where the training will be conducted, participants shall present a valid medical fitness certificate stating that they are "FIT FOR DUTY", issued by an authorised medical practitioner in their respective countries of origin.

Participants shall also possess valid medical insurance providing coverage in the Argentine Republic for any circumstance requiring specialised medical assistance.

3. COURSE CONTENT:

UNIT I: COURSE INTRODUCTION AND SUBJECTS RELATED TO ILLICIT DRUG TRAFFICKING. Human Rights. Global, regional and local situation of illicit drug trafficking. Trafficking routes. Emerging modi operandi. Types of criminal organisations. Geopolitical and strategic aspects of illicit drug trafficking in Argentina. Information exchange and international cooperation. International law-enforcement agencies involved in combating organised drug-related crime.

UNIT II: OPERATIONAL PLANNING. Preparation, planning, direction, execution and security measures applicable to patrol operations. Employment of patrols in forest and jungle environments. Incidents and subsequent actions in border areas involving drug trafficking, environmental offences and other forms of criminal activity.

UNIT III: LAND ORIENTATION AND NAVIGATION. Land navigation exercises. Use of satellite navigation devices and Global Positioning System equipment. Practical exercises.

UNIT IV: FIRST AID. General definitions of first aid. Accidents. Concepts of victim and injured person. Primary care. Assessment of the victim. Legal provisions applicable to accidents. States of consciousness and unconsciousness. Trauma. Fainting and syncope. Shock. Epileptic seizures. Convulsions. Classification and treatment of burns. Sunstroke. Heatstroke. Lacerations. Insect and animal bites or stings. Fractures. Muscle cramps.

Definition and techniques of cardiopulmonary resuscitation. Respiratory and cardiorespiratory arrest. Causes and consequences. Hypoxia. Procedures to be followed when performing cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

UNIT V: PHYSICAL AND MENTAL CONDITIONING. Strength, aerobic endurance and speed exercises.

UNIT VI: CARTOGRAPHY. Classification of maps according to scale, designation and intended use. Marginal information: map name, sheet number, survey information, scale, contour interval, edition or reprint, projection, geographical coordinates, grid coordinates, grid sectors, political boundaries, sheet location, general location, declination diagram, cartographic symbols, coordinate scale and triangulation points. ArcGIS: Map production. Preparation of topographic maps, special-purpose maps and other cartographic products. Preparation of terrain models and sand tables: types of terrain models and sand tables, tactical uses at different scales, and modelling materials.

UNIT VII: SNAKEBITE ENVENOMATION. Introduction to snakebite envenomation. Different families, genera and venomous and non-venomous species found in the Argentine Republic. Types of venom. Types and use of antivenoms. Actions that should and should not be taken in the event of a snakebite.

UNIT VIII: OPERATIONAL EMPLOYMENT TECHNIQUES. Characteristics of special operations in forest and jungle environments. Geographical characteristics. Operational requirements. Logistical requirements. Preparation and configuration of equipment. Daytime individual combat techniques: general principles, basic rules, cover, concealment, camouflage, crawling techniques and firing positions. Patrol operations: general principles, classification, organisation and equipment. Movement techniques during patrol operations: movement, tactical displacement, procedures during halts and rest periods, procedures in hazardous areas, procedures in assembly areas, obstacle-crossing procedures, selection of rally points and security during movement. Combat procedures: general principles, infiltration and exfiltration, link-up operations, reconnaissance, raids, ambushes, withdrawal, escape and evasion, resistance as prisoners of war, and the blocking of lines of communication.

UNIT IX: INTERVENTION TECHNIQUES. Mental preparation. Principles of close-quarters combat and relevant operational factors. Guidelines for individual actions. Basic operational intervention procedures. Intervention operations for special forces. Specific considerations. Phases. Organisation. Combat roles. Approach techniques: crossing hazardous areas, progressive clearing by two-person teams and larger teams, clearing L-shaped and T-shaped corridors by two-person teams and larger teams, team approaches to stairways, mechanical breaching techniques and use of ballistic shields.

UNIT X: SMALL-ARMS EMPLOYMENT TECHNIQUES. Nomenclature and operator-level maintenance of the FN FAL 7.62 × 51 mm rifle. Nomenclature and operator-level maintenance of the Benelli M3 12/70 semi-automatic shotgun. Nomenclature and operator-level maintenance of the Beretta 92FS 9 × 19 mm semi-automatic pistol.

UNIT XI: FIRE-AND-MOVEMENT EXERCISES. Operations under low-light conditions, including tactical movement, night firing, use of flashlights and firing with vehicle-mounted illumination. Weapon malfunctions and remedial actions. Search, location and identification of targets under psychological and physical pressure. Firing under different weather conditions. Vehicle-related techniques: firing from or around vehicles, use of vehicles as cover, and vehicle entry and exit procedures..

UNIT XII: AIR-GROUND COOPERATION TECHNIQUES. Aircraft guidance through visual signalling and telecommunications equipment. Infiltration and exfiltration using a platform or mobile anchoring system. Rappelling techniques, including backward-facing, forward-facing and inverted rappelling.

UNIT XIII: INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION: Legal framework. Concept of international police cooperation. Objectives of international police cooperation. Current challenges facing international police cooperation. Operational and institutional requirements addressed through international police cooperation. Principal tools for international police cooperation. National Directorate for International Cooperation of the Ministry of Security. Directorate for Cooperation and International Relations of the Argentine National Gendarmerie. International police cooperation mechanisms. Cooperation agreements between the Argentine National Gendarmerie and counterpart agencies.

UNIT XIV: CRIME ANALYSIS. Fundamentals of crime analysis. Cycle of analysis and interpretation of criminal phenomena. Criminal profiling and analytical methods applied to illicit drug trafficking.

UNIT XV: IDENTIFICATION, MANAGEMENT AND RESOLUTION OF IRREGULAR FLIGHTS. Basic concepts relating to an Irregular Air Traffic event, referred to by the Spanish acronym TAI. Elements involved in the different phases of managing a TAI case. Types of categories. Aircraft types and technical specifications. Reference points and coordinates identifying a TAI event. Sighting and tracking of the event. Coordination with the Argentine Air Force. TAI event-management flowchart. Communications and coordination procedures. Collection of information regarding the intruding aircraft. Tactical analysis of information. Physical inspection of the aircraft and verification of its documentation. International cooperation. Judicial intervention. Security and tactical measures for approaching the aircraft. Physical and documentary inspection. Official proceedings and communications. Applicable regulatory framework. Practical exercises involving the analysis and assessment of information for potential operational deployments.

UNIT XVI: PRESERVATION OF THE CRIME SCENE AND EVIDENCE. Definition and classification of a crime scene, as well as the guiding principles governing its preservation. Basic security, isolation, area-protection and access-control criteria intended to prevent the alteration, contamination or loss of evidence that may be relevant to an investigation. Crime-scene preservation procedures, including the establishment of security perimeters, designation of work areas, initial observation of the scene and preliminary documentation through written records, photography and planimetric records.

Identification and classification of physical, biological, chemical, documentary and digital evidence, together with the criteria governing its proper location within the scene. Evidence-search and collection techniques. Procedures for recovery, packaging, labelling and preservation of physical evidence, in accordance with established forensic protocols. Chain of custody. Scientific foundations of forensic science as applied to crime-scene investigation, with particular emphasis on Locard's Exchange Principle.

UNIT XVII: RECOGNITION OF IMPROVISED EXPLOSIVE DEVICES.

Definitions and basic concepts relating to non-standard explosive devices. Composition and constituent elements of an explosive device. Classification according to general characteristics and methods of employment. Types of devices and risks associated with their presence or handling. Mail-related terrorism: concepts, indicators and response procedures. Security measures for the prevention, detection and response to incidents. Minimum actions to be taken upon discovering suspicious items, including preservation of the scene, protection of personnel and coordination with the competent authorities. Planning and implementation of operational security measures in different operational environments.

UNIT XVIII: PROFESSIONAL PHYSICAL AND MENTAL CONDITIONING:

Methods and techniques for developing coordination and physical-conditioning capabilities. Basic gymnastics and training techniques.

4. RISK CONTROL:

The training activities will be conducted while maintaining risks at the lowest tolerable level. Risks associated with the exercises will be reduced and controlled through the implementation of all preventive safety measures agreed upon with professionals from the relevant specialist areas. These measures will include the deployment or availability of ambulances, physicians, nurses, physical-education instructors, nutritionists and other required personnel.

b. Teaching Methodology:

Presentations, guided discussions, questions, demonstrations, practical exercises based on simulated situations and role-playing activities. Practical field exercises will be conducted during both daytime and nighttime hours. These activities are based on the need for participants to acquire operational capabilities and skills that may be required under real-world conditions during either the day or night. The activities are intended to simulate realistic scenarios associated with the participants' future professional duties.

c. Assessment:

Group exercises will be conducted throughout the course at the conclusion of each thematic unit. These exercises are intended to support the participants' learning process and, where necessary, reinforce the content delivered during the classes. Practical activities will form part of the assessment of each participant's progress.

Four integrated exercises will be conducted:

- 1) Integrated exercise involving (TAI - TEI).
- 2) Final integrated exercise.

A qualitative assessment of the theoretical and practical content will be conducted in order to determine the participants' progress throughout the course.

A final exercise covering all course content will also be conducted. Participants must obtain a grade of at least FOUR (4) points to pass. Participants who do not pass the initial assessment may take a remedial assessment using the same examination format. A minimum grade of FOUR (4) points will also be required to pass the remedial assessment.
